

# The Camp Holloway Memorial Wall 52nd Aviation Battalion Begins Construction



The 52nd Aviation Battalion is building a replica of the Camp Holloway Memorial Wall that they built in Pleiku, Vietnam during the Vietnam War. The wall contains the names of those members of the battalion who paid the ultimate price of war.

Construction began in May with a groundbreaking ceremony and will continue over the next several months. A dedication ceremony is planned for October of 2008 during the battalion's annual reunion. The public will be invited, so watch this newsletter for details and plan to attend this momentous event. The 52nd Battalion is seeking help with this project.

#### How Can You Help?

The total cost of construction is estimated at \$40,000 to \$60,000. Some donated and discounted materials are being provided and volunteers are offering their services to reduce the cost. However, your significant contributions will still be needed to complete the wall.

#### What's Next? Rock Creek Link Trail Project

The museum has signed an agreement with the Lake Mineral Wells State Park to create a link trail from the State Park Trail system to the Meditation Garden. Of course this link trail will allow visitors to enjoy all the improvements on the museum property as it develops.

The name Rock Creek was chosen for this link trail because the town of Rock Creek, a once-successful coal-mining town, was formerly located adjacent to the southern edge of the museum property. Settlement in Rock Creek began in the late 1870s. Originally, the village served as a church community for nearby farmers and ranchers. Later, it adopted the name Rock Creek after the railroad that reached the area in the 1880s. In 1891, a post office branch opened to serve the estimated 75 residents.

By the mid-1890s, Rock Creek had been transformed into a thriving mining community. The population reached 400 in 1896 and was estimated at 1,500 during the first decade of the twentieth century. Mining and coal shipment peaked between 1900 and 1910. After 1910, the cost of recovering the coal became prohibitive and the mines closed.

Over the next few years, more and more residents left, until all that remained was the town's cemetery. During World War II, Camp Wolters was extended to cover the original town site of Rock Creek.

The Rock Creek link will be built this year, perhaps this summer depending on the weather.
