Unveiling of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall

Over 2,000 people attended the unveiling ceremony on May 30. We now have a permanent replica of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall in place for anyone to visit 24/7.

In the picture below, you can see cars parked under the bridge, beside the highway and our 12 acres full of cars and motorcycles. In the center of the picture, you will see an American flag that is hanging from the leg of Dana Bowman as he parachutes in to begin the event.

Joe Galloway gave an inspirational presentation. Music was provided by the Hog Leg Band and Tory Powers. The Liberty Bell was on hand for all to ring, and hundreds of Patriot Guard Riders encircled the event. Governor Perry sent a special message as did Congresswoman Kay Granger. The Travis Elementary School cadets sang the Armed Forces Medley and the Star Spangled Banner while the colors were presented. The presentation of the colors included the South Vietnamese color guard presenting the South Vietnamese colors. A large contingent of
